Benedict XVI, Pope Regina Caeli (2006) May 14, 2006

On this Fifth Sunday of Easter, the liturgy presents us with the passage from the Gospel of St. John in which Jesus, speaking to the disciples during the Last Supper, exhorts them to remain united to him like branches to the vine. This is a truly significant parable, because it expresses with great effectiveness that Christian life is a mystery of communion with Jesus: "Whoever remains in me and I in them," says the Lord, "bears much fruit; for without me you can do nothing" (Jn 15:5). The secret of spiritual fruitfulness is union with God, a union realized above all in the Eucharist, rightly also called "Communion." I am pleased to emphasize this mystery of unity and love at this time of year, when many parish communities celebrate children's First Communion. To all the children who in these weeks are encountering Jesus in the Eucharist for the first time, I wish to extend a special greeting, hoping that they may become branches of the Vine, who is Jesus, and grow as true disciples of his.

A sure way to remain united to Christ, like the branches to the vine, is to turn to the intercession of Mary, whom we venerated particularly yesterday, May 13, remembering the apparitions of Fatima, where in 1917 she appeared several times to three children, the shepherds Francisco, Jacinta and Lucia. The message he entrusted to them, in continuity with that of Lourdes, was a strong exhortation to prayer and conversion, a truly prophetic message, considering that the 20th century was shaken by unprecedented destruction caused by wars and totalitarian regimes, as well as by widespread persecutions against the Church.

Furthermore, on May 13, 1981, 25 years ago, the Servant of God John Paul II felt he had been miraculously saved from death by the intervention of "a maternal hand," as he himself said, and his entire pontificate was marked by what Our Lady had announced at Fatima. Although there was no lack of worries and suffering, and although there are reasons for concern for the future of humanity, what comforts us is what the "white Lady" promised the little shepherds: "In the end, my Immaculate Heart will triumph."

With this certainty, we now turn with confidence to Mary Most Holy, thanking her for her constant intercession and asking her to continue watching over the path of the Church and humanity, especially over families, mothers and children.
